


◆ Corpus of modern Chinese lexicon

A treasure of resources related to East Asian cultural studies

We will transform materials owned by our University into a digital archive, including the Institute of Oriental and Occidental studies, the General Library, the Museum, the Research Center for Naniwa-Osaka Studies, as well as numerous precious resources of the Hakuen collection of the Hakuen Shoin (Hakuen Academy), a root of our University. The project will also promote the construction of an integrated archive based on mutual links with collections of numerous institutions abroad, such as the British Library, the Bibliothèque nationale de France, the Vatican Library and Harvard University; it will encourage research on related materials about East Asia as well.



Conforming to the international standard for digital archives IIIF (International Image Interoperability Framework)

A place open to researchers and citizens

According to the objectives under "three openness", the project will create an open platform as a place accessible to everybody, including of course researchers of East Asia, researchers from other fields, educational institutions, enterprises, local entities and also common citizens who share these interests. The project will make digitalized research and educational activities available globally.

Possessing world-leading materials pertaining to research on cultural contacts between East and West, the project will contribute to the globalization of cross-border knowledge of Asia.

By clarifying the activities of the Hakuen Shoin, a school that took charge of the education of citizens in the early modern period and in modern times, we will re-evaluate the cultural position of Osaka. Moreover, by building an archive of Osaka painting circles and organizing an exhibition, thanks to the cooperation of the British Museum and the University of London, it will be possible to rediscover the Osaka painting circles, hidden behind the history of Japanese fine arts.

Space and time of ancient cities and historical landmarks

Following the most recent excavations in Nara prefecture, we want to enhance the achievements of our University, with discoveries as important as the Takamatsu tomb. Thanks to databases for the reconstruction of historical landscapes based on old maps, illustrations and ancient documents owned by our University, we will open the fields of urban landscape studies of the Kansai region in the early modern period and modern times, offering resources to local entities and schools.
